## ☐ Self-employment (Business revenue and expenses) **Standard Mileage Deduction Business Use of Your Home** The standard business mileage deduction for 2015 is \$0.54 /mile. If Rent, if you are renting your home your business is not home based, then you may not take a Mortgage interest, real property taxes, PMI deduction for the mileage from your home to your principal place insurance Utilities, such as natural gas, of business. Any other business related mileage should be electric, propane Trash service, pest control deductible. This includes mileage to pick up supplies, to do your service business banking, to make deliveries, to visit customers or potential Homeowners or renters insurance customers, to the post office, to meet with the accountant or Regular maintenance of the home attorney, and to stores or business suppliers. However, if you add on services for the business, Contract Labor such as call waiting or distinctive ring tones, these may be Interest on a business loan deductible. Parking and tolls for business travel Long distance phone charges and phone cards for business Equipment purchases calls Association and membership fees Accounting and legal fees for the business Meals and entertainment (these are usually only 50% Health insurance premiums deductible) Office Supplies Utilities - Electric, heat Business liability insurance Cost of inventory items that sold (do not include unsold Rent of business equipment inventory) Donated inventory - check with your accountant Rent or lease of storage facilities for special rules Answering services Postage and shipping Rent or lease of business space Education and seminars - must be related to your current Maintenance and repairs of equipment or business business, not for a new career space Shop supplies Customer gifts Business property taxes Software purchases Business travel - hotel, parking, air and bus fares, Software subscriptions, such as security software taxis Internet service Merchant fees for your credit card sales Web site hosting, design, and domain names Bank service charges Cell Phones Depreciation on the cost of furniture and equipment that you Books, newspapers, magazines for business owned before you started the business, such as desks, purposes computers, file cabinets. - check with your accountant **OTHER ITEMS** Any changes to personal profile: Marital status, Dependants, Address & Phone Number (*Please ensure that* we have record of all your dependants) Home Buyer Plan and/or Life Learning Plan repayment schedule Direct deposit information - bank account transit, bank, and account information or a void cheque (note that the CRA will stop issuing refunds by cheque in 2016) Fill out and sign attached Engagement Letter and return to our office Province of residence on December 31, 2016 Previous Personal Income Tax Notice of Assessment Tax installments paid in 2016 Details on foreign property owned any time in 2016 GST return to file Are you a US Citizen? Please advise us. **NOTICES** If you are going to be away on vacation during tax season please inform us and bring in your records as early as possible We can not guarantee completion of your tax return by April 30 if records are received after April 22 **IMPORTANT DATES** Feb 28, 2017—last day to contribute to RRSP in order to deduct it on your 2016 tax return

May 1, 2017—Tax balance due for all 2016 tax returns and filing due for most taxpayers

June 15, 2017—Tax return filing due for self-employed taxpayers
